 - 1. Continue to update Policy and Procedure Manual
 - 2. Agenda Template- Cindy sent out
 - 3. Student AARC membership reimbursement
 - a. Increased from \$35 to \$40 (we budgeted \$35)
 - b. Cindy sent out a letter to all 6 schools to pick 1 student
 - 4. Increase minimal credential level for licensure in Iowa to RRT
 - a. We would have grandfather clause
 - b. Survey state to see if there is support for it

- d. Why don't we develop a program similar to nursing (LPN, RN, BSN)? - because AARC says CRT is the minimal credential
 - i. Evidence between CRT vs RRT

 - i. \$66 now, was going to be \$120
 - ii. 1,666 license respiratory therapists, 93 duel license resp/poly, and 50 polysomnography only
 - iii. Polysomnography pays \$300 every 2 years
 - iv. Legislators thought we should cover the bill for polysomnography since there isn't as many of them compared to us. We said no because we told them it would be costly due to not as many poly. We said we would give a little, but not allow double amount (\$120)
